






No. 3 18001 Bryn Mar Lane




No. 4 9842 Ludwig St.

The exterior of their lovely home is enhanced with bouquet canyon stone, which is used throughout the pool and patio area, and adorns the family room fireplace.




The Andersons have lived in Villa



During your tour, relax and enjoy the appealing yard of Sharon and Tom Malloy's house where a box lunch will be served between the hours of 11:00 am and 3:00 pm. Soft breezes drift across the scenic rear yard of their home in a setting which typifies the charm and tranquility of Villa Park and its outdoor family living. These beautifully manicured grounds provide a welcome retreat from the bustling world of Orange County outside Villa Park. Of special sentiment to the Malloy family is the fact that the yard was transformed into an "outdoor chapel" two years ago to serve as the site for their daughter Bridgett's wedding.

As with many of Villa Park's residents, the Malloys came to this community as the original owners of their home nearly 13 years ago. The creation of the present parklike beauty of the yard required a considerable amount of creativity and vision. The pie-shaped lot, which was one of the last in the subdivision to be sold, was essentially an unappealing hill of dirt on the one side and an impractical gulley on the other side. Tom, a contractor by profession, was able to visualize the spacious effect you now see, and by moving the bulk of the dirt mound into the ravine, created the yard's versatile and practical layout.

A particular note of interest illustrates that experienced creativity. The overhang on the east side of the patio, which was built by Tom and their son, uses a mundane piece of construction equipment in a very unique way. The entire structure on that side is held up by a "shore" — one of the massive iron supports which are placed in ditches to shore up construction work — which has been painted white and blends into an integral part of the aesthetics of the structure.

Hardy, reliably attractive plantings make this a yard to be enjoyed year round by the active and varied age groups which make up the Malloy family. Bridgett - 27, Kevin - 26, and Kelley - 23 are now grown and "on their own". However, keeping Tom and Sharon company in their absence is the youngest of the clan, 7-year-old Ryan, who continues to put to good use the play equipment which makes the yard so typical of our community. And, lest we feel nostalgic that these signs of childhood may soon be forgotten as Ryan himself grows up, it adds a heartwarming continuity to know that Bridgett, the bride who said "I do" in this very spot, and her husband John are expecting the Malloy's first grandchild in the near future. Modern science has disclosed that the baby is a "he", so it appears that Ryan's swing set won't be empty for long!

High on a hill with a spectacular view, is the country manor of Pat and Sue O'Brien. The O'Briens moved into their home less than one year ago and have accomplished wonders since that time. This home had been unoccupied for more than a year when Pat and Sue moved into it and began immediately to take it apart. The kitchen was torn down to the studs and the creation of the delightful room which exists today began immediately, with layout by Karen Costello of West Coast Kitchens. Sue is well known throughout Villa Park as a gourmet cook who truly lives up to the title and the kitchen is, quite logically, her first love. The artistic interests of the O'Briens extend even to the tiles in this room, all of which are handpainted.

The interior design of the 5,130 square foot four bedroom home was executed by decorator Bonnie Court and has been planned around the O'Briens extensive collection of art. Paintings and sculptures throughout the house are largely the work of local artists. However, of particular interest are the works of French painter Jacques Harvey, known as the "master forger of Europe". Harvey, who has been featured in People Magazine and commissioned by celebrities such as Johnny Carson and Lucille Ball, created three of the artworks displayed in the home; the Renoir copy in the dining room, the Van Gogh copy in the second floor guest bedroom, and the Dufy copy in the first floor guest room. Each of the works was painted specifically for the O'Briens, and they are beautifully displayed to showcase Harvey's unique artistic talent.

The entire home has been lightened and brightened through the use of bleached and pickled woods which replaced the previous dark wood finishes. Background colors are soft creams, off-whites, peaches, blues and greens with bright colors introduced through fabrics, flowers and art pieces.

Pat is the owner of twenty-one Domino Pizza stores in Orange County and shares with Sue a great interest in art as well as an appreciation of gourmet dining — which prompts them to be "regulars" with the Villa Park Women's League couples gourmet group!


The spacious dining room offers the perfect setting for the antique mahogany Empire style table and chairs, which have been in Steve's family for many years. The adjoining kitchen has been recently remodeled and enlarged with the addition of an appealing breakfast nook. Also added to the original floor plan is the game room as well as an addition to the master bedroom.

The second floor features a spacious and versatile center for informal entertaining with a corner fireplace, large wet bar and juke box. With two daughters, Lindsay - 13 and Stephanie - 16, the Frys find this room a favorite with the teen-age set. In addition, the adjoining guest suite provides visitors with a virtual "home within a home" setting.

Steve's hobby of gardening is evident in the attractive landscaping which surrounds the home. Step into a truly extraordinary home which is a tribute to contemporary art deco and technology. Bill and Barbara Carr have, in two years time, transformed their home into a reflection of their imagination and vision. They have designed, contracted and decorated the house themselves and have loved every moment. This has indeed been a family effort with Barbara the chief decorator, husband Bill the "design consultant" and adult son Jeff the electrician, whose touch is quite evident throughout the house in the special lighting techniques as well as the comprehensive intercom system.

The house features a basic color scheme of gray, black and white with touches of color to accentuate the lovely art wall hangings, sculptures and the unique design of the furnishings. The Carrs acquired their art pieces at auctions, on trips and from contemporary furniture stores where they also discovered the interesting modern furniture. Abundant stainless steel, as seen in the stairway banister, and chrome add to the flavor, with some pieces being chromed specifically to fit the decor, such as the brass dog in the family room. With a unique ability to visualize and acquire the look she wants, Barbara has employed unusual and interesting techniques such as the use of tiered ceilings throughout the house and the columns at the door to the family

room, which are formed from sauna tubes.

Highlights of the living room include the huge smoked glass mirror above the custom made mantle and the infinity wall light to the right of the Grecian marble fireplace. The dining room is a study in mirrors with artwork by Otsuka, "Whispering Butterflies", displayed amid the reflections. The kitchen maintains the contrasting decor with black European modular cabinets, recessed lighting under the upper cabinets and the latest technical advances in food preparation.

The "Charlie Chaplin" room, with leaded glass designed and made by Barbara, seconds as guest bedroom. Displayed here are Bill's old toy collection and his Chaplin memorabilia including a wind-up Charlie which Barbara gave him. The master bath is a dramatic black and white tribute to Barbara's talent which created the spatial effect with tiles from Italy individually purchased and positioned. The skylight adds to the "look" and, as is true of all the baths, the room is served by under cabinet "toe-kick" lighting.





A white picket fence charms the eye and invites you to explore the country garden of John and Esther Spence. From the time he was a child on a farm in Iowa, John was inspired by his grandfather to love plants and enjoy gardening. He has created a peaceful garden incorporating both flowering plants and an extensive vegetable garden which also includes 25 fruit trees.

Following the meandering brick pathways through this beautiful garden takes you under an arching arbor and past bed after bed of blooming perennials. John has included Oriental lilies, day lilies, hydrangeas, and several bushes planted specifically to attract butterflies. Charming garden accents along the way include a bird bath, presided over by a friendly raccoon, and a large variety of birdhouses, which John has hand-crafted. 

Their charming Tudor-style home is nestled in the woods at the end of a quiet cul-de-sac. The meticulously groomed front yard is beautifully landscaped and dominated by a giant coral tree. All of the design and landscaping of this home has been done by the Malloys, who have lived here for 23 years.

The tasting of fiesta flavors will be served in the Malloys' gorgeous backyard garden, which has an expansive lawn bordered by beautiful trees, including apple and peach. Notice the magnificent eucalyptus, which was on the property at the time the home was constructed.

Directly behind the house is the swimming pool, with nearby filtered shade provided by a freestanding pavilion, which has a slated wood cover and a swing for poolside visitors. An orange tree from the original orchard has been preserved in a circular brick planter.

Adjacent to the kitchen area of the house are the brick outdoor food preparation bars, a sink, and a built-in barbecue, with shade from a lovely ficus benjamina.

The outdoor living area is ideal for both formal and casual entertaining and has been the setting for the weddings of two of the Malloy children. Now their six grandchildren are frequent visitors, enjoying the pool and park-like atmosphere.

Tom is semiretired, having given the management of their equipment rental business to their son. He owns and races old Indy race cars, and Sharon has been active in VPWL for many years.
